



The Transitional Safety Practitioner (TSP) Designation Application Instructions

When you obtain a credential from a Qualified Equivalent Program (QEP), you are eligible to apply for the Transitional Safety Practitioner (TSP) designation. You must apply within the program's applicable dates, as it appears on the website www.bccsp.org/tsp.

Steps to apply:

1. Have your official certificate with the date you achieved it ready for upload during the application process.
2. Create an account on the BCCSP website. Go to www.bccsp.org and click on "My Profile" on the upper right-hand side of the page. On the "My Profile" page, click "New Customer? Click here."

3. Once registered your main menu will have a tab "Applications."

4. Choose “Apply for Certification” or if you have already opened the application, choose “My Applications”



5. Click on “Transitional Safety Practitioner (TSP).”

6. Complete the application and submit.
7. To check on the status of your application or to complete/submit a previously started application, log in to your account from “My Profile” and choose the main menu option “My Applications.”
8. Once your TSP application has been submitted and approved, your TSP designation will be awarded. You will receive an email confirmation and be able to view your digital badge and wall certificate through your profile. You may request a hard copy of the wall certificate by contacting Customer Engagement Services at bcsp@bcsp.org.
9. In November of each year, you will receive an annual invoice to maintain your designation. You must keep your designation active to qualify to sit for the CSP exam.
10. You may hold the TSP designation for up to six years. Upon having a minimum of a bachelor’s degree and four years of professional level safety experience, you may log in to your **My Profile** account and submit a CSP application. (www.bcsp.org) If you let your designation expire, you will not be able to reinstate it at a later time.
11. Once you achieve the CSP, your TSP designation will expire.
